I continue to mentor current, prospective, and former students from underrepresented back-grounds in nursing towards healthcare careers. Since completing our Pipeline to Healthcare Careers Youth Program Partnership with Highland Hospital we published an article highlighting the importance of including youth from diverse underserved communities as Standardized Patients in an empowering role, first program and resulting article of its kind. I continue to mentor students from that program, some of which have entered nursing school! I continue to be faculty advisor for Nursing Students of Color on Campus, and support faculty and students in collaboration with the campus mediation resource team to heal around the current issues in the country presenting within the classroom dynamics. Through the OSHPD grant I have been working with Lisa Mihaly for the last school year to develop an antiracist FNP faculty curriculum for AY 2021-22 based on the toolkit from the SOM.

TEACHING AND MENTORING

TEACHING SUMMARY

Didactic teaching in the FNP Program:

I continue to teach PBL in the Fall and Spring. Since 2018 Lisa Mihaly and myself revamped the N217A/B FNP Vulnerable Populations series into N217F. For 2020-2021, N217F "Racism, Healthcare, and Social Justice" was expanded to double the learners to include FNP, PNP, AC-PNP, and Neonatal NP students. The focus was updated from cultural humility to structural racism framework and aligns with the structural core competency requirements for MS students. We joined with Linda Stephan and consulted with the Structural Competency Working Group to examine course content and teaching strategies. We have just been approved to provide the course as a core course for all MS student in the SON in AY 2021-2022.

Procedural skills lab teaching: Created formal course for FNP program Advanced Practice Outpatient Procedure Skills.

I have completed x workshops within the Teach for UCSF certificate program and would like to return to continue refining my skills. I am also looking for a EdD program that can fit my needs as FNP faculty to improve the way we teach structural racism and competency to healthcare providers.

RESEARCH AND CREATIVE ACTIVITIES

RESEARCH AND CREATIVE ACTIVITIES SUMMARY

In collaboration with Naomi Schapiro and Linda Stephan from the Pediatric Nurse Practitioner Program, we developed the Pipeline to Health Careers Project collaborating with Oakland Unified School District and Highland Hospital. Through that grant I worked on the UCSF Adolescent Standardized Patient Internship, training the first adolescent standardized patients to be used at the UCSF Kanbar Center. For this program, I adapted and updated a Youth Standardized Patient curriculum, recruited and worked closely with a high school drama teacher to train the adolescent actors in character development, and community building with the youth interns as well as community collaborators.

The program focused on increasing UCSF graduate students awareness and responsiveness of youth healthcare access and nurturing interest in healthcare careers and advocacy skills of the interns and is the first program we are aware of that specifically recruits underrepresented youth interested in health careers to teach them these skills. We published an article in 2019 about the program highlighted in the publication section. I continue to mentor the youth who passed through the program and some have entered nursing and other health careers.

I was also invited to co-author an article on threats to adolescent confidentiality for Women's Health issue of Nursing Clinics of North America, which was published in 2018. It has continued to be cited by other authors highlighting contribution and relevance to the field.

Our aim is to increase the exposure of Oakland youth to health careers at UCSF, and to work with Oakland school based health centers to provide meaningful internships to high school youth. As our showcase project in Year 2 we developed and evaluated the first adolescent standardized patient training program explicitly designed to increase self-confidence and career exploration in adolescents from disadvantaged backgrounds who are interested in health care careers. We evaluated their authenticity and ability to give feedback to NP students, as well as the impact on their self-efficacy and deeper understanding of health care through multiple methods. Using grounded theory methods, we will analyze the first sets of data and refine questionnaires and qualitative data collection for year 3.

ADDITIONAL RELEVANT INFORMATION

I had complications during pregnancy, gave birth at 28 weeks 12/23/2019, baby was in NICU for 2 months. As a result of the unexpected early delivery and leave of absence, the DEI pilot arranged with Judy Martin Holland ended early. Due to this and start of pandemic with medically vulnerable neonate with frequent medical visits, and homeschooling 3 children in elementary school, I took an extended medical leave. I enthusiastically returned to teaching and engaging with students Sept 2020, taught PBL and worked intensely with Linda Stephan and Lisa Mihaly for the expansion of N217F. My clinic position at Roots was not held and I was informed Dec 2020. I continue to work at YWP as fill-in NP, and am actively working on restarting clinical contract and precepting at Native American Health Center this summer/fall. My next priority is pursuing EdD and continuing faculty development classes/programs specifically around antiracism curriculum development.
