PM Pediatrics- Pediatric Urgent Care Fellowship

- Provide urgent care medicine to 30-50 patients per day at pediatric specific urgent care company which locations throughout the Maryland area. Performed procedures including but not limited to:
 - Sutures, X-ray and interpretation, Foreign Body removal – Ear, Eye, Nose, Soft tissue, Abscess I&D, Fluorescein exam, ocular irrigation/decontamination, Nerve blocks, Splinting, Simple joint reductions – shoulder, patella, finger/toe, radial head subluxation, Procedural Sedation, and Tick removal

 - Neurological devastation, including traumatic brain injury, seizure disorders, and spinal fusions requiring acute intracranial monitoring;
 - Patients requiring simultaneous sedation, paralysis, bedside dialysis, vasopressors, and ECMO (extracorporeal membrane oxygenation);
 - Complex oncology patients in multi-system organ failure.
 - Dialysis (CVVH, CVVHD) Super-User.

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Living Donor & Pediatric Kidney Transplant Nurse Coordinator

- Critically evaluate both pediatric and adult end-stage renal-failure (ESRD) patients prior to kidney transplant, both living donor and deceased donor
- Provide comprehensive pre-operative care for pediatric patients with complex medical histories including Alport's Syndrome, Lupus, Vasculitis, Posterior Urethral Valve, Diabetes, HTN, bleeding disorders, seizure disorders, hypercoagulability disorders, and cancer.
- Critically review complex medical histories and serologic lab work. Recommend specific pre-transplant testing based on history. Provide referrals and communicate follow up related to infectious disease, oncology, dermatology, endocrinology, and cardiology.
- Analyze complex antibody and antigen assays for HLA matches in paired-kidney exchange. Ensure donor-specific antibodies are not present. Organize logistics of crossmatch for pairs.

- Trained as birth doula through Johns Hopkins School of Nursing Community Perspectives on the Childbearing Process course
- Provide services free of charge: prenatal visits (including assistance with creation of birth plan, if desired), labor support (including continuous presence and complementary interventions), and postpartum visits.
 - Work jointly with women with high-risk pregnancy, including preeclampsia, gestational diabetes, and uterine abnormalities.
 - Help prepare mothers for possible NICU stays (especially if expected for a high-risk pregnancy), c-section and induction.
