• 911 Honduras, Tegucigalpa, Honduras 04/2020 - 05/2020

During the pandemic of COVID-19, a special unit of volunteers was created to answer phone calls from patients who were referring symptoms of COVID 19 or need some assistant. I became part of this volunteering team to answer phone consultations once per week, where I took a brief medical history and provide the consulting patient with a treatment plan over the phone. Telemedicine is non a common practice in Honduras but the unit receives more the 100,000 calls per month. This has helped reduce the number of visits to the ER and hospitals preventing further propagation of the virus.

 One world surgery & Our little brothers NPH, Talanga, Honduras

01/2020 - 02/2020

One World Surgery is a non-profit U.S. organization that in partnership with Our Little Brothers, responded to an overwhelming need for quality surgical care in Honduras. The organization supports the Holy Family Surgical Center located in Talanga, Honduras. They arrange multiple medical brigades to provide medical and surgical treatment under American standards. I had the privilege to join the team for 2 months and as in other medical brigades I participated in, I assumed multiple duties. These duties included acting as; attending physician, surgical assistant, and Spanish medical interpreter. It was an honor to be a part of this amazing team. It allowed me to learn how to work outside our comfort zone. This particular brigade provided surgical intervention to hundreds of patients during those two months, allowing patients to have access to prosthesis, surgical implants and procedures that they would have never been able to afford.

 International Medical Relief, Montaña de la Flor, Honduras

12/2019 - 12/2019

International Medical Relief is a registered medical organization with NGO status, based in the United States. The mission brigade I volunteered with provided medical attention in several villages in Honduras. Some of these included, Santa Maria del Real, Guapote & Montana de la Flor, where health care is almost nonexistent. Montana de la Flor is a very remote location of an indigenous population named Tolupanes. Most of this population lives in extreme poverty & suffers from malnutrition. I had the privilege to help provide medical care to this population alongside many other physicians, nurses & dentists. It was truly an honor to serve this particular indigenous population. It astonished me that even though we are living in the same country & in the same century, the gap between their reality & conditions with the general population is measurable. If the general population in poverty conditions are precarious, the living conditions of these indigenous people is even more so precarious.

• Global Health Outreach, Tegucigalpa, Honduras Surgeon 11/2019 - 11/2019

Global Health Outreach is a short-term international mission organization. The program I volunteered with was an orthopedic surgery mission team at Hospital Escuela and Hospital San Felipe. These are the two main teaching hospitals in Honduras. The team worked alongside and partnered with Honduran surgeons, surgical residents, anesthesiologists, operating room nurses and other hospital staff. The team offered training in surgical procedures that would allow Honduran medical staff to advance their skills and provide an increased level of care after

the team departed. Medical mission teams often provide advanced equipment such as the ones necessary for arthroscopic and laparoscopy procedures. The US physician in these brigades help, train the surgeons in appropriate use of this equipment and then leave the equipment to the hospitals.

• US navy Enduring promise mission USSN Comfort, Trujillos, Honduras

12/2018 - 12/2018

The USSN Comfort was an 11-week medical support mission trip to Central and South America as part of the United States Southern Command's Enduring Promise initiative. They work in partnership with health departments and governments in Ecuador, Peru, Columbia and Honduras. The medical team on the ship provides medical care on board and at land-based medical sites, helping to relieve pressure on the national medical systems. I stayed on board the USSN Comfort for 8 days to serve as an interpreter between the members of the medical team and patients. I was given the opportunity to also observe surgeries, procedures and medical rounds.
