FALL SAFETY CHECKLIST

- QI Project implemented on a 12-bed inpatient Vascular Surgery unit during the Fall of 2021
- Educated unit staff on the importance of fall safety and in various fall prevention techniques
- Collaborated with key stakeholders and Unit Champions
- Increased staff participation in identifying potential fall risks
- Empowered nurses to individualize safety protocols for each patient
- Successfully reduced the overall number of patient falls
